Feastdays of the week

Friday St. Martin de Porres 1579-1693. Martin was the illegitimate son of a Spanish grandee and a Peruvian Mother. He joined the Dominicans as a lay-helper. His dedication to the poor was so impressive that he was invited to make profession as a lay-brother. He would spend nights in prayer and penance and his days in nursing the sick and the plague-stricken, working for his monastery as barber, gardener, and consellor. Aged 60, he died of a violent fever. His recognition as Patron of race relations was due, not to any political or revolutionary activity but to his universal, caring charity to people of all races whom he served without counting the cost.

St. Winefride. Winifride lived in the 6th or 7th century near Treffynon (Holywell) in Clwyd. According to one version of her life, she was beheaded by a prince whose advances she refused, and springs of water sprang up at the place of her martyrdom. She was, however, restored to life by her uncle, St Beuno, and lived the rest of her life as a nun. Holywell has remained a place of healing and pilrimage through penal times to the present day,

Saturday St Charles Borromeo. 1538-84 Charles was born of an aristocratic family. Aged 22 he gained his doctorate, by which time his uncle had become Pope Pius IV and heaped honours on his nephew now living in some style in Rome. Charles desired to leave the papal court and become a monk but he was dissuaded from this. He became very influential in the final session of the Council of Trent particularly in drafting the Catechism. He had considerable influence on the Counter-Reformation. In 1564 he was ordained a priest and consecrated bishop and as a papal legate for all Italy. He held a provincial council in Milan and set about reform. Famine struck Milan twice and each time he was prominent in aiding the hungry and nursing the plague-stricken, not only organising the relief work but taking a personal part in it.

Thursday is the **Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.** (Holy Souls).
