REFLECTION ON THE LORD'S PRAYER – Hallowed be Thy Name

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2807-2812) explains "Hallowed be Thy Name" in the context of the Lord's Prayer as a call to recognize and honour the holiness of God's name. Here's a summary of the key points from the Catechism:

Recognizing God's Holiness: The phrase "Hallowed be Thy Name" acknowledges the sanctity of God's name. It calls for reverence and adoration for God's holy nature, asking that everyone hold His name sacred and honour it.

Living Holy Lives: The petition also challenges believers to live lives that reflect God's holiness. By following God's will, believers can contribute to sanctifying His name in the world. Therefore, their actions should bring glory to God and not dishonour His name.

Manifesting God's Kingdom: This phrase is linked to the coming of God's kingdom. When believers honour God's name and live holy lives, they help manifest God's kingdom on earth. This petition desires God's rule to be acknowledged and realized worldwide.

Role of the Church: The Church is the community through which God's name is hallowed. Through its teachings, sacraments, and members' lives, the Church seeks to sanctify God's name and spread His holiness.

Biblical Foundation: The holiness of God's name is rooted in Scripture. Various biblical passages emphasize the sacredness of God's name and the importance of honouring it (e.g., Exodus 3:14-15, Ezekiel 36:23, and Psalms 111:9).

Theological Depth: The Catechism explains that to hallow God's name is to enter a deeper relationship with Him. It reflects a verbal acknowledgement and an engagement in a holy life that glorifies God.

In summary, the Catechism's explanation of "Hallowed be Thy Name" underscores the importance of revering God's name, living in a way that honours Him, contributing to the manifestation of His kingdom, and recognizing the Church's role in sanctifying His name through its mission and the lives of its faithful.

We look forward to reflecting on "Thy Kingdom come, and Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven" next weekend."
