Dear Parishioners

In these challenging times it's reassuring to hear these words from the **Right Rev Michael Curry**, presiding bishop and primate of the Episcopal Church in the United States. He reflects on the description of God's expansive love found in the Bible.

Love is a firm commitment to act for the well-being of someone other than yourself. It can be personal or political, individual or communal, intimate or public. Love will not be segregated to the private, personal precincts of life. Love, as I read it in the Bible, is ubiquitous. It affects all aspects of life....

An oft-quoted passage in the New Testament says, "God so loved the world that he gave his only son" [John 3:16]. The Greek word used by the New Testament writer for the word love is agape. And the Greek word used for world is kosmos, but what it really means is "everything"—"everything that is." Kosmos is what the spiritual is talking about when it says of God, "He's got the whole world in his hands." God so loved the world that he "gave."

God gave. God did not take. God gave. That's agape. That's love. And love such as that is the way to the heart of God, the heart of each other. It is the way to a new world that looks something more like God's dream for us and all creation.

Love as an action is the only thing that has ever changed the world for the better. Love is Martin Luther King, Mahatma Gandhi.... Love is a little girl in Pakistan named Malala Yousafzai standing up to armed men who said that girls shouldn't be educated....

Love is a firefighter running into a burning building, risking his or her life for people he or she doesn't even know. Love is that first responder hurtling toward an emergency, a catastrophe, a disaster. Love is someone protesting anything that hurts or harms the children of God. Jesus said it this way, hours before his crucifixion: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's own life for one's friends" [John 15:13].

Love is a commitment to seek the good and to work for the good and welfare of others. It doesn't stop at our front door or our neighbourhood, our religion or race, or our state's or your country's border. This is one great fellowship of love throughout the whole wide earth, as the hymn goes....

Where selfishness excludes, love makes room and includes. Where selfishness puts down, love lifts up. Where selfishness hurts and harms, love helps and heals. Where selfishness enslaves, love sets free and liberates.

The way of love will show us the right thing to do, every single time. It is moral and spiritual grounding—and a place of rest—amid the chaos that is often part of life. It's how we stay decent in indecent times. Loving is not always easy, but like with muscles, we get stronger both with repetition and as the burden gets heavier. And it works.

A big thanks to all who helped make the first anniversary of St Mary's becoming a cathedral so special. Thanks to Archbishop Malcolm, and also to Canon Aidan Prescott, Monsignor Tony O'Brien, Canon Dave Heywood and Canon John Gorman – all members of the Chapter of Canons of Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral, who travelled across to take part in the celebration. A particular thanks to the choir. They have been working overtime recently with the nine days of our Novena. Their singing makes all the difference. It is said that to sing is to pray twice. They have done that for us many times over. And thanks to those who set out our drinks and nibbles and stayed late afterwards to clear up. It was also good to welcome Martin Miller, Chief Operating Officer of the Archdiocese, who joined us for the Mass. Martin is here to support members of the Isle of Man Deanery Synodal Council as they take part in this Saturday's Archdiocesan Synodal Council. He has brought with him the technical wizardry which will ensure the Isle of Man has fully interactive engagement in the Council's proceedings.
