19th Sunday of Ordinary Time

We may be in what we call Ordinary Time in the Church calendar, but that 'ordinary' time is peppered with extraordinary memorial and feast days, extraordinary events and people but, for the most part, people like you and me, just ordinary people – but doing extraordinary things or following their hearts in extraordinary ways.

Yesterday, we had the feast of St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, otherwise known as Edith Stein. Next Thursday we will have the Memorial of St Maximilian Kolbe.

Edith Stein was an academic and had a distinguished career as a philosopher before converting from Judaism to Christianity and becoming a Carmelite nun, ultimately being killed in Auschwitz in August 1942.

Maximilian Kolbe was a Franciscan priest prodigious religious communicator via newspapers, periodicals and radio, travelling as far as Japan, Moscow and Malabar. He too was imprisoned by the Nazis in Auschwitz where he died of starvation, having volunteered to take the place of another inmate, who had a family, who had been chosen by the guards to die that way.

St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and St Maxmilan Kobe their stories and their faith journeys have much to teach us We are continually faced with the need to make decisions – decisions about our daily lives, moral judgements, choosing one path over another. Constant choices. Perhaps, if there is a lesson to be gained from the lives of extraordinary people like Edith Stein or Maximilian Kolbe, it might be to pray and to try to take the right path, when we have to make these small decisions every day. Making the right choice, taking the right path, doing the right thing in small ways can become a natural, easy decision for us. It doesn't require heroism or any special gifts, but practice and prayer will strengthen our moral compass and can lead to extraordinary things.
