The boat may be small, but the hope it carries is vast.

These days, the BCC News is filled with the cries of small boats, the fragile vessels carrying men, women, and children fleeing danger, poverty, or persecution. These cries are not new to humanity's story; the Bible is a migration book.

Abraham left his homeland for a place God would show him (Genesis 12:1). Israel wandered through the wilderness seeking the Promised Land (Exodus 16). The Holy Family fled to Egypt as refugees to protect the Child Jesus from Herod's wrath (Matthew 2:13-15). Fear is real, for those who leave, uncertain if they will survive the journey, and those who receive, unsure of the change that strangers may bring.

However, Scripture repeatedly reminds us: "Do not be afraid, for I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10). God calls us to see the stranger not as a threat, but as an opportunity to welcome Christ Himself: "I was a stranger, and you welcomed me" (Matthew 25:35). "Immigrants often arrive with little in their hands but much in their hearts; faith, resilience, and dreams". They bring the hope of rebuilding life, just as Ruth the Moabite brought new life to Bethlehem's fields and became part of the lineage of Jesus (Ruth 1–4).

For Christians, hope is not naive optimism; it is rooted in the God who journeys with His people. "When fear tempts us to close our doors, hope urges us to open our hearts". In welcoming the stranger, we participate in God's great migration story, moving the world closer to His kingdom, where "nation will not lift sword against nation" (Isaiah 2:4) and all will dwell in safety.

In conclusion, migration stories teach us that hope overcomes fear. By welcoming the stranger, we honour their resilience and embody God's love, moving closer to a world where all dwell safely, united in compassion and purpose.
