#### **Reflection for Prisons Week 2025**

Prisons Week is an established initiative by the Churches in England and Wales to encourage us to focus once a year on people in prison, their families, victims and all those working with prisoners. The "Prisons Week Prayer" is included in this Newsletter. But why should we focus on prisons and prisoners?

Many UK prisons face serious overcrowding of cells and facilities, a scandal that has persisted for over 70 years. Conditions for both prisoners and staff are often poor with very limited regimes including too few opportunities for rehabilitation.

As Christians, what should be our approach to prisoners? St Matthew's Gospel Chapter 25 includes prisoners as one of those groups for whom Christians should demonstrate special care. Our care for prisoners is one of the tests to be applied to each of us on judgement day.

In practice, what can we do to help? Support the SVP because their work with families and individuals includes people at risk of offending. Supporting the SVP is crime prevention in practice. While our Jurby prison is quite new and well equipped, the Island's prison population has grown considerably in recent years. There is much to do to reduce offending and to keep people safe. Those of us with long experience of working with offenders know that the way to reduce re-offending by those released from prison is to have a positive regime with demanding programmes.

Many prisoners have previously been in care; have never attended school regularly and have poor experiences of family life. Many prisoners need to improve their literacy and numeracy; to develop skills and experience in order to obtain and keep jobs on release; to be challenged over addictions to drugs and alcohol. Many need to experience positive relationships especially with people in authority.

So, what should we reflect on during our prayers for Prisons Week? Carefully reviewing our own attitude to offenders should be a priority. Please remember the many volunteers and staff working with prisoners. Finally, Prisons Week seeks to reduce the number of victims of crime - we should pray for victims that they may experience the healing touch of God's grace.
