Christ the Alpha and Omega: Feast of Christ the King and First Sunday of Advent

Feast of Christ the King, Year C, presents a striking paradox: Jesus reigns not from a throne of gold but from the cross. His crown is of thorns, His sceptre a nail, His glory revealed in mercy. When the repentant thief prays, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom," Christ responds with the promise of paradise. This moment reveals the heart of His kingship: a reign of forgiveness, compassion, and hope.

The First Sunday of Advent, Year A, then invites us to live in readiness for that same King's return. Isaiah's vision of nations streaming to God's mountain and Paul's call to "wake from sleep" remind us that Christ's reign is not only future but already breaking into our present. The Gospel warns us that His coming will be sudden, urging us to stay awake and walk in the light.

Together, these readings form a powerful bridge: Christ reigns now in mercy, and He will come again in glory. The cross teaches us that His kingship is rooted in love, not domination. Advent teaches us that our response must be vigilance, living each day as citizens of His kingdom.

As we move from the Feast of Christ the King into Advent, we are reminded that the King we await is the same one who hung on the cross and offered paradise to a thief. His reign is already among us, and our Advent watchfulness is not anxious fear but joyful readiness. We prepare not for a distant monarch but for the merciful King who knows us, loves us, and will come again to bring us fully into His kingdom.

I wish you all a grace-filled Advent.
