#### Vatican News.....

Pope Leo XIV on Wednesday strongly condemned antisemitism during his general audience in St. Peter's Square marking the 60th anniversary of *Nostra Aetate*, the Second Vatican Council document on the Church's relations with other religions. The Pope underlined that since the publication of *Nostra Aetate*, "all of my predecessors have condemned antisemitism with clear words." "And so I too confirm that the Church does not tolerate antisemitism and fights against it, on the basis of the Gospel itself," Pope Leo said. The Pope expressed thanks for what has been achieved in the past 60 years of Jewish-Catholic dialogue while acknowledging the challenges that have arisen along the way. "We cannot deny that there have been misunderstandings, difficulties, and conflicts in this period, but these have never prevented the dialogue from continuing," he said.

## Pope calls for renewal of Catholic education amid challenges of modern society,

**technology.** Amid contemporary challenges to schools and universities — hyperdigitalization, social insecurity, and the crisis of relationships — a Catholic education should courageously teach the whole human person, Pope Leo XIV writes in a new apostolic letter. In "Drawing New Maps of Hope," Pope Leo reflects on the role of a Catholic education 60 years after the Oct. 28, 1965, proclamation of Gravissimum Educationis, the Second Vatican Council's declaration on Christian education. "The Church celebrates a fruitful educational history but also faces the imperative to update its proposals in light of the signs of the times," the Pope. "We are aware of the difficulties: hyper-digitalization can fragment attention; the crisis of relationships can wound the psyche; social insecurity and inequalities can extinguish desire," he says. "Yet, it is precisely here that Catholic education can be a beacon: not a nostalgic refuge but a laboratory of discernment, pedagogical innovation, and prophetic witness."
