Advent: A Spiritual Pilgrimage - Hope, Peace and Conversion.

As we move deeper into Advent, the season leads us along a spiritual journey from Hope to Peace, guided by the Scripture readings of Year A and symbolised by the lighting of the Advent candles. On the First Sunday of Advent, we lit the Candle of Hope, reminding us that Christian hope looks forward with trust and readiness. The Gospel called us to a spirit of watchfulness as Jesus said: "Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (Matthew 24:42). Like the people in the days of Noah, we can easily be absorbed in daily routines and overlook God's invitations. Hope keeps our hearts open, expectant, and alert to God's presence in the ordinary moments of life. It encourages us to remain faithful even when the world around us is uncertain or distracted.

This weekend, on the Second Sunday of Advent, we light the Candle of Peace, and we hear the strong, urgent voice of John the Baptist. The Gospel proclaims: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" (Matthew 3:2). John appears in the wilderness as the one who "prepares the way of the Lord, make his paths straight" (Matthew 3:3), calling each of us to examine our hearts and clear away whatever blocks God's peace. True peace is not merely calmness; it is the fruit of a life turned toward God. Repentance opens the door to this peace. It straightens what has become crooked, heals what is wounded, and restores our relationship with God and with one another.

Hope and peace, therefore, go hand in hand. Hope makes us watchful for God's coming, and repentance prepares the inner space where Christ's peace can take root. As we continue our Advent journey, may our hope keep us awake to God's presence, and may our conversion lead us into the deep peace Christ desires to place within every heart.
