**Jubilee Year 2025:** During the year of the Jubilee the parish motto will be, “Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.” (Rom 12:12)

**When will the Jubilee close?** The Jubilee Year, themed “Pilgrims of Hope,” officially began on 24th December 2024. This start was marked by the opening of the Holy Door at St Peter’s Basilica in Rome, which is the traditional liturgical way the Catholic Church inaugurates a Jubilee Year.

In Rome: The Jubilee Year concludes on the Feast of the Epiphany, 6 January 2026.

St. Mary and St. Columba Parish, due to the absence of some parishioners and friends from the Island, the Parish Pastoral Council, with the approval of the Parish Administration Team, has decided to celebrate the conclusion of the Jubilee on March 1, 2026. The organizing team will provide the program as soon as possible.

**Offertory Collections:** The offertory collections for December amount to £1128.26. The second collection for the Christmas flowers for the churches was £355.43. We raised £600 for the Christmas envelopes. We will send a cheque of £300 to the Friends of the Holy Land. Thank you very much for your generosity.

**Thank you:** Fr Joseph and Fr Augustine would like to thank all the parishioners who sent Christmas greeting cards to them.

**Annual Holiday:** Fr Joseph is going on his annual holiday from 4<sup>th</sup> January to 4<sup>th</sup> February. While Fr. Joseph is away Father Augustine Ogbonna will attend to all the liturgical needs of the parish, assisted by the Deacons and Brendan O’Friel.

**Island Spirituality Network:** On Saturday 10 January at St John's Mill, 10 am-1 pm, Canon Philip Gillespie will be the guest speaker. His theme will be "There and Back Again – The Jubilee Year as Pilgrims into Hope." The Jubilee Year 2025, proclaimed by Pope Francis, has just ended and its themes emphasized the journey of faith, spiritual renewal and forgiveness amidst global suffering from war, poverty, and crises, rooted in biblical tradition of debt relief and liberation, with a focus on peace, debt cancellation, and sharing faith. All are welcome.
