Though the forty days of Lent ended with Palm Sunday, we now enter the most-solemn week of the Church's year, Holy Week.

This is a most significant week in the Church's Liturgy as we are invited to associate ourselves closely with the final days of the Lord Jesus' earthly life and it is right that we are encouraged to participate as frequently as possible in the Liturgies.

One of the things we have reflected upon in these past weeks of Lent has been what can be seen as the ' three legs' of our Christian living – to KNOW, to LOVE and to SERVE.

We come to KNOW the plan and purpose which God has for our lives through the supreme gift of Jesus; we learn how to LOVE because we see the example of self-giving which Jesus shows us through his teaching, the healing he brings to the lives of others, and ultimately the suffering and passion of Good Friday; we see how SERVE - and the meaning of caring for others - by the washing of the disciples' feet and the giving of himself in the gift of the Holy Eucharist, Holy Communion.

The concept of SERVICE can sometimes be presented in a very negative sense, putting yourself down and failing to highlight the inherent dignity which each human life has. Far from it ! To SERVE – in the sense of to care for the good of others – is the highest dignity of human life : it is our vocation, our calling from God and, in our Christian vision of life, it is what brings us ultimate happiness or BLESSEDNESS, closeness to God.

In the events of Holy Week we see different aspects of how Jesus SERVES..... how he looks to care for the good of others , that is the good of you and me.

May Holy Week be a time of blessing for us all.
