Change

Change is one of the inevitable facts of life. We can embrace or resent it, or be somewhere on the scale between those opposites, depending on what the change is. But we can't escape change, it's out of our control. I'm conscious that this is a time of change for the parishes and not at the best of times. As communities, we're mourning Fr Brian's death. I know from Mum's death last July, that bereavement is not a quick process.

Bereavement usually tops the list of life's most stressful changes. I'm particularly conscious of change and its impact, because this period is a time of change for me too. Moving home and a career change usually appear on the list of stressful changes, both of which I'm experiencing at the same time. As we begin to live this change together, let's hold each other in prayer and give each other the patience and understanding we all need as we move forward together.

Fr John has been the Roman Catholic chaplain at IOM Prison Jurby since summer 2023 and prior to that he was one of the chaplains at HMP Altcourse, Liverpool.
