JC33 Isle of Man

2030 will mark approximately 2,000 years since Jesus of Nazareth began his public ministry that transformed history. Christians believe that after around three years of public ministry, Jesus was crucified, rose from the dead, and continues to offer people today a living relationship with God. This is the faith of around 2.6 billion Christians worldwide.

JC33 Isle of Man will loosely follow the timeline of Jesus' life and ministry over two and a half years, from Christmas 2030 to Pentecost 2033, culminating in the 2,000th anniversary of his death and resurrection.

The programme will include five or six major events on the Island each year. Other events will take place regionally or focus on particular groups, such as children, church leaders, training, or opportunities to share the message of Jesus. Individual churches will be encouraged to participate as much or as little as they choose. Any church can run as many or as few events / opportunities as they wish over the three years.
