This weekend marks the first anniversary of Mum's death. In some ways it seems like no time at all since she died, and in others it seems a long time.

I used to talk to Mum on the phone and later on FaceTime every day. I particularly miss her when something happens: I would have talked to her about the football (she was more knowledgeable and interested in it than me) and no one would have taken delight in my meeting The King and shaking his hand this week than she would have.

I was blessed in having a mum who truly took a great interest in her children, like no one else in my life. This weekend I was torn about what to do; go to hers and Dad's grave in Southport, or stay here and celebrate Mass for her with the friends and parishioners I'm called to serve. I decided to go with the latter. I'll be over later in the month to the grave when I do a baptism I'd agreed to before Fr Brian died and I was appointed.

Talking about our loved ones who have died and gone before us is one way of keeping their memory alive, so never feel shy about doing it.

Another way is having a Mass celebrated for them, which, along with pray for the repose of their souls, is one of the practical things we can do for our loved ones who have died.

Eternal rest grant unto Mum, O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon her. May she rest in peace. Amen.
